

# Parent/Carer notes - Autumn Term 2 2022 Acorn Class



Dear Parents,

Our topics for Term 2 are 'Once Upon a Time' and 'Sparkle and Shine'.

Once Upon a Time: This project supports children to develop a love of stories and reading. It encourages children to learn, retell and act out familiar and traditional tales including Cinderella, Goldilocks, Little Red Riding Hood, The Three Little Pigs and The Three Billy Goats Gruff.

During this project your child will be introduced to the wonderful world of stories. We will listen to a range of traditional tales and have the chance to act out the stories in our play. We will also listen to alternative contemporary stories to see different viewpoints from the characters. We will use the stories to think about how life has changed from when the stories were written. We will also make up our own stories and make masks, props and puppets to act out our stories.

**Sparkle and Shine:** In the Sparkle and Shine topic, we will explore different celebrations that take place in autumn and winter, focusing on the significance and symbolism of light at this time of year. We will take part in a variety of creative activities and discover more about how Christmas, Diwali and Hanukkah are celebrated around the world.

#### Supporting your child at home

## Once Upon a Time:

- Read traditional stories and fairy tales to your child.
- Visit your local library and choose picture books to share.
- Talk about the characters in stories and whether they like or dislike them.
- Talk about how the characters in stories behave and what they could do differently.
- Share and discuss the; Did you know? resource.

#### Sparkle and Shine:

- Talk about special events that you celebrate at home.
- Share photos of events that you celebrate.
- Talk about how you prepare for special celebrations including the clothes you wear, food you prepare and gifts you
  give or receive.
- Share and discuss the; Did you know? resource.

## Homework:

**Reading books**: As children begin to decode and blend, they will be bringing home books with words in (how exciting!). These books will have been read three times at school focussing on:-

Read 1: Decoding and Blending - teaching children the ability to apply their knowledge of letter-sound relationships to correctly pronounce written words.

Read 2: Prosody - teaching children to read with understanding and expression.

Read 3: Comprehension - teaching children to understand the text.

Reading books will have been carefully matched to your child's current reading level. If your child is reading it with little help, please do not worry that it is too easy - your child needs to develop fluency and confidence in reading.

Listen to them read the book. Remember to give them lots of praise - celebrate their success! If they cannot read a word, read it to them. After they have finished, talk about the book together. Don't forget to colour in one star each time you read together.

PLEASE ENSURE THAT THE BIG CAT READING PRACTICE BOOKS ARE RETURNED ON A MONDAY IN ORDER FOR ANOTHER GROUP TO USE THEM FOR MONDAY, TUESDAY AND WEDNESDAY'S READING PRACTICE SESSIONS.

**Phonics Books:** The pink phonics books are updated each Thursday/Friday with the new sounds we have learned in school during the course of the week. Please encourage your child to say the sound; teach you the formation phrase for writing the letter; find objects around the house that begin with the initial sound; trace over the letter; write the letter. I enjoy rainbow writing - write the letter in as many different colours as you have.

Last term, I added our Term 1 decodable words and Tricky Word list to Seesaw, practise reading these words as often as possible. Challenge, ask your child to orally spell the words out for you and try writing them.

### Mrs Philpott's Library

In order to encourage your child to become a lifelong reader, it is important that they learn to read for pleasure. The **sharing** book is a book they have chosen for you to enjoy together.

Please remember that you shouldn't expect your child to read this alone. Read it to, or with them. Discuss the pictures; enjoy the story; predict what might happen next; use different voices for the characters; explore the facts in a non-fiction book. The main thing is that you have fun!

These books will go home on a Friday and are to be returned the following Friday in order for the children to choose another book. Many of these books are my own so I request that they are handled with care please!

#### Ed Shed and Numbots

I have issued all children with log-ins for Ed Shed and Numbots which can be found in their reading diaries. Ed Shed and Phonics Shed will support the children with using the graphemes to spell.

#### PE Kit:

Our PE session (when we change) is Thursday afternoon. To ensure that all children can fully participate in PE lessons, please ensure that they have their 'named' PE kits in school throughout the term, earnings are removed and hair tied back.

The correct PE kit includes:
