Chronological Understanding	- Sequence events in their own lives - Recognise past and present	- Place events on a simple timeline - Use dates and terms such as ancient, modern	- Place key events, people, and changes on a timeline using appropriate chronological vocabulary
Historical Enquiry	- Ask and answer simple questions about the past using pictures and stories	- Use evidence (artefacts, documents, buildings) to ask and answer questions	- Evaluate sources for reliability and usefulness - Begin to formulate structured enquiries
Understanding of Events, People and Changes	- Identify significant people and events (e.g. Florence Nightingale, Great Fire of London)	- Describe how people and events changed society or were influenced by the time they lived in	- Explain causes and consequences of events, and make links between different periods
Interpretation of History	- Recognise that the past can be represented in different ways (stories, pictures, drama)	- Understand that different sources offer different viewpoints	- Analyse different interpretations and begin to explain why interpretations differ
Organisation and Communication		- Present findings in various ways (writing, drama, ICT)	- Use historical terms and concepts accurately in written and oral presentations
Use of Sources	- Use photographs, objects, and simple stories to find out about the past	- Use a wider range of sources, including written accounts and oral histories	- Critically assess primary and secondary sources, and consider bias and perspective
Historical Vocabulary	- Use everyday terms like "long ago", "before", "past", "now"	- Begin to use historical terms such as "century", "BC/AD", "empire", "civilisation"	- Use historical terminology confidently and correctly, including abstract terms like "democracy", "economy"
